✓ Fathers are invited to volunteer at the school. Research has shown that when dads are involved in their child's education, grades increase, behavior problems decrease, and the general self-esteem of the child grows.

Family Reading Night - October 18, 2018

✓ Parents and students spend time reading together and rotating between literacy stations to engage in curricula related activities.

Book Fair - October 15 - 19, 2018

✓ Parents and students spend time shopping together for books, posters, bookmarks, pencils, or erasers.

Accelerated Reader Lab – January 15, 2019 – April 25, 2019

✓ Parents and students spend time reading together. Students take Accelerated Reader (AR) tests on the computer to earn points toward AR rewards.

✓ Parents and students spend time together exploring various science experiments and math activities.
